Our Policy

Safe Transport on Public Road is part of focus area 'Workplace Safety'.

All employees who drive on a public road on company business need to comply to the safety transport guidelines, in order to prevent injuries to others, themselves and avoid any damage to equipment, materials and otherones properties.



WHAT THIS MEANS FOR YOU

The safe way is the right way

- >> A formal training, on how to drive and operate specific equipment, including cranes and (un) loading on site, has to be received before conducting any work.
- >> Be aware of the risks of unsafe behavior on the public road.

Don't walk past a hazard

- >> Management must be notified of every defect to the truck and/or load immediately.
- >> Keep yourself and others safe by addressing unsafe behavior seen in colleagues, suppliers and customers. Speak up!

Think first, behave safe

- >> Check your truck daily when driving on public roads on behalf of your company.
- >> Always follow all applicable traffic rules.
- >> Safe behavior must be displayed in all daily activities.
- >> Wear your seatbelt at all times while driving.
- >> Only use your phone handsfree. If you don't have a carkit for handsfree use, don't use your phone while driving!
- >> Do not exceed the allowed driving hours.

- >> Never operate a truck under the influence of drugs or prescription-only medication. Inform your manager in case you are using this kind of medicines and align on feasible tasks.
- >> Always wear high visibility clothing when leaving the truck.
- >> First secure the public area for using a crane when you are unloading at the customer site.
- >> Address unsafe behavior seen in colleagues, suppliers and customers.
- >> Involve your Manager and/or Safety Officer in case advise or assistance is needed on site.
